

The term Terroir – *Taste of place* in **English – describes the characteristics** of a crop that are directly linked to its habitat. In viticulture those are

predominatnely natural factors such as the soil and the climate. For the seminar we borrow this term and expand it to the anthropogenic. **TERROIR** brings us to the Lavaux, the area between Lausanne and Montreux.

For almost 1000 years, the hills in the Lavaux have been cultivated and shapped by humans. The walls and terraces were once started by monks to make the landscape growable. Over time the settlements around the hills have grown into major business and education hubs. And thanks to the 18th century British travellers, the spectacular views over the lake are now a must for all tourists.

As a result of this, the terraced landscape have grown into one continuous architectural construct reaching from the busy city centre of Lausanne to the fancy hotel balconies of Montreux. This Architecture is on one hand protected by the UNESCO world heritage status and on the other hand a living machine that not only exports wine and music but also an idealised image of Switzerland into the whole world.
