Together we want to examine the spatial consequences and potentials of a historical political event: the Brexit. One week before the supposed withdrawal day –on Oct. 31<sup>st</sup>– we will investigate different places, where architecture and politics join(ed) and produce(d) specific socio-economic settings. There, we will meet different characters from the fields of architecture and design, theory and the arts, economy and the laws and speculate about the future: how will we live together?

This seminar week is not about the great picturesque architectural objects that London has to offer – it is about the content and context these objects produce. It is about underlying systems and stories, how people live(d) together in different ways. Thus, we address students who are willing to actively participate in an (architectural) expedition that won't be all inclusive, meticulously planned, and only enjoyable but allow for interesting discussion about, and spontaneous insights in, a specific moment of space and time.
