The Japan Studio fosters architectural cultural exchange between Japan and Switzerland, seeking innovative solutions to global sustainability challenges. The studio is collaboratively curated by an accomplished teaching team from Japan, including Kozo Kadowaki, a distinguished theorist, practitioner, and architect; Ryoko Iwase, an adept architect and landscape designer; and Takahiro Kai, an architect, construction engineer, and skilled craftsman.

The task: design and construct a captivating tea room encircling the Alumni Lounge on ETH Campus Hönggerberg. The distinctive twist lies in the utilization of construction waste materials originating from the former Huber Pavilions and other structures. Unlike other studios, the designed structure and its components will be assembled and produced for real-scale use in Alumni Lounge.

Drawing inspiration from Japan's early modern wooden architecture, known for its circular economy principles and resource efficiency, students will reinterpret these concepts for contemporary Switzerland. This architectural heritage, rooted in recycling and reusing resources, resonates with modern challenges like resource scarcity and urban complexity. The project aims to cultivate a new architectural philosophy and technology as a response to the impending era's demands.
